

# Carbon Manager Pilot Program

## Are you a large emitter, ready to decarbonise? This opportunity is for you!

RACE for 2030 CRC aims to support Australian businesses undergoing decarbonisation and energy transition by growing their internal expertise. The Carbon Manager Pilot Program will partially fund five positions focused on reducing emissions of five shortlisted organisations. RACE partners or aspiring partners, who are large emitters from both private and public sectors are eligible to apply.

### Value

RACE will support 5 large emitters by:

- Contributing \$65,000 towards the salary of a Carbon Manager for the first 12 months of engagement
- Helping with the onboarding, training, and mentoring of a Carbon Manager
- Facilitating a knowledge-sharing environment for the selected partners and Carbon Managers

### Requirements

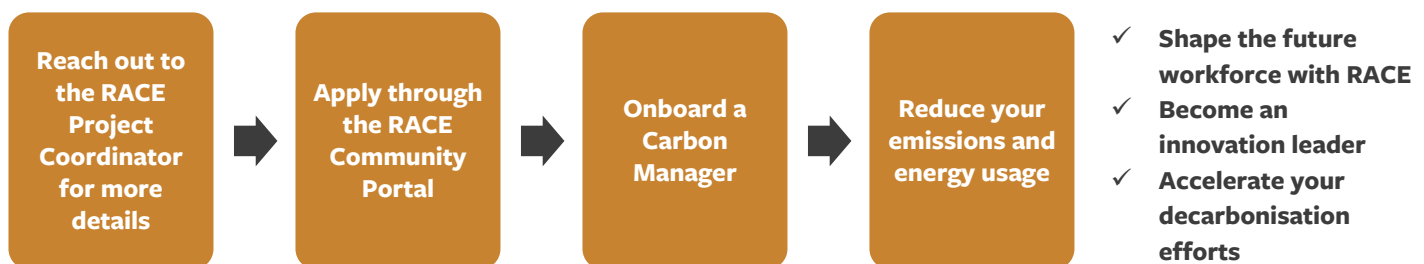
Program participants will attribute \$65,000 towards the 12 months' salary of the Carbon Manager and facilitate the job position within their structures.

### Eligibility

The program is open to all current or aspiring RACE partners. We welcome organisations working in all sectors of the Australian economy, who are:

- Large greenhouse gas emitters (25+ktCO<sub>2</sub>e p.a. actual or estimated)
- Diverse emitters, generating significant emissions in scopes 1, 2 & 3
- Organisations who are ready to undertake action to reduce scope 3 emissions
- Organisations who are keen to share findings of the project with the public in the form of aggregated data, to inform other capacity building programs
- Innovative entities, willing to onboard a change maker

### Process



### What is a Carbon Manager

A Carbon Manager's main goal is to reduce the carbon footprint of an organisation. This includes greenhouse gas emissions generated directly through the activities of an organisation (scopes 1 & 2) and along its entire value chain (scope 3). A Carbon Manager is involved in developing an ambitious net zero strategy for an organisation and drives its implementation. The undertaken measures are active - focused on reduction of the emissions, rather than passive - focussed on acquiring carbon offsets.

Depending on the emissions profile of the organisation, the Carbon Manager can engage in a variety of activities to achieve the net zero goal, such as:

- Undertaking energy efficiency upgrades
- Introducing on-site renewable energy generation and green energy procurement
- Process and logistics optimisation
- Product redesign and waste reduction
- Community and staff engagement
- Development and implementation of new internal policies and carbon accounting systems
